Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope that you have had a lovely Christmas and New Year's break. We are very excited to welcome the children back to Term 3.

Warning Around Aqua Beads

Parents and early years settings are being warned to keep water beads out of sight and reach of young children as they pose a 'serious' choking risk and can cause intestinal blockages.



Parents are being warned to keep water beads away from very young children. Water beads are sold as tiny pellets which gradually expand when soaked in water. They are often used as sensory toys and more recently in pellet or water guns. They are small and colourful, making them attractive to toddlers and babies, who may instinctively put them in their mouth, says the Competition and Consumer Protection Commission (CCPC), which has put out the warning.





Guidelines for parents from the CCPC

- Keep water beads away from young children.
- Supervise older children when they are using water beads, allowing them to play with water beads only after the beads have expanded.
- Ensure that the water beads are thoroughly cleared away after use, checking under furniture or other objects for any that may have rolled away.
- Dispose of water beads safely when no longer in use.
- Keep older and younger siblings' toys separate; this can help prevent younger children from getting their hands on toys that are not age appropriate.
- Always check the recommended age range on toys. Most water beads are only recommended for children 5 years old and older.

News from the Local Authority

Enable Multi Academy Trust, the Department for Education, and ISG Construction are working in partnership with South Gloucestershire Council to build a new 112 place special school to support pupils aged 2 to 19 years old with severe learning difficulties and profound and multiple learning difficulties.

It will be an 'all through' school providing places from nursery to 6th form, and sited next door to Marlwood School. The school is expected to open in September 2024, with phased admissions over the first 3 years.

Your child will need to have an Education, Health and Care Plan to be eligible for a place.

You should speak to your SENCO or case coordinator to discuss in the first instance. <u>Details of all special</u> <u>schools in South Gloucestershire</u>.

Any requests for a place at Two Bridges Academy will be considered by the South Gloucestershire Placement Panel working with Enable Multi Academy Trust/Two Bridges Academy. <u>Find out more</u>
