**1****BRISTOL MUSEUM & ART GALLERY**

Discover Egyptian mummies, learn all about dinosaurs, rocks and wildlife and explore the art galleries.

**2****LOWER WOODS, NEAR WICKWAR**

The largest ancient woodlands in the south west, famous for its butterflies with 32 reported species being found there.

**3****KINGSGATE PARK, YATE**

An adventure playground and a duck pond, with a café and pub nearby.

**4****SCHOOL HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES AND FOOD PROGRAMME**

Book for your child to take part in fun holiday activities and food clubs, develop skills, learn about healthy, tasty food and eat it with new friends. Places are FREE for children aged 5-16 on benefits-related free school meals. Visit [www.southglos.gov.uk/HAF](http://www.southglos.gov.uk/HAF)

**5****M SHED**

From prehistoric times to the present day, M Shed tells the story of Bristol through film and photographs, rare and quirky objects and interactive displays.

**6****FROME VALLEY WALKWAY**

A lovely walking route following the River Frome from Old Sodbury through to Chipping Sodbury and Yate. The route carries on towards Iron Acton and beyond to Bristol, with many interesting things to spot along the way.

**7****BRISTOL & BATH RAILWAY PATH**

A 13-mile cycle path which is traffic-free and almost entirely flat as it runs along a disused railway line. Lots of scenery to enjoy and many things to spot along the way.

**8****CONHAM RIVER PARK**

One of the best walks around Bristol as it's surrounded by trees and follows the winding River Avon. There is also a car park and toilets situated on site.

**9****WILLSBRIDGE MILL**

A wildlife garden, fairy wood and café, nestled in a beautiful woodland.

**10****YATE HERITAGE CENTRE**

Explore the history of Yate and the surrounding area and its transformation into a modern town. There are regular events and exhibitions.
